


CDAIDE IMPACT REPORT

THIS HAS BEEN A HARD

Stressors on hospitality sector workers are everywhere evident in CDA. Our local workers have been some of the hardest hit by both Covid shutdowns and illness; they were considered dispensable but we've also learned how critical their services are. As the local economy speeds back, unfortunately they work in chronically under-staffed environments, often doing the job of 2 to 3 people. Guests are sometimes more difficult than usual because of pandemic fatigue and because service quality suffers when businesses are under-staffed. This creates even more stress for workers, who may be inclined to leave hospitality for something else. Those who remain behind must carry even more load. Workers who were always vulnerable are hit harder than ever now. Yet many truly love their work and serving patrons in our beautiful community. They remain upbeat and show true hospitality and professionalism despite these challenges.





When CDAIDE reached out to my family we were having medical issues with one of my children. I was not only struggling financially but also emotionally. My daughter had just gotten out of the ICU and I was unsure of what to do next. Thanks to this caring and kind organization, I was able to see a light in all of my struggles. No home, no stability. **No stability, no health, and on and on.** With little financial margin, workers who face the unexpected costs that come with everyday life can suffer from a breakdown of carefully planned, but precarious, resources. You can help with providing the tire that preserves a life.

CDAIDE serves Coeur d'Alene-area hospitality workers by meeting their immediate needs, connecting them with resources for longer term self-sufficiency, and ensuring they feel valued, respected and loved.





While many hospitality workers have had an income boost during this period with plentiful jobs and rising wages, the lack of affordable housing has limited these gains. CDAIDE is serving an alarming number of parents who are working full-time but living with children in cars or tents.

This housing market is unforgiving to those on the margins. Landlords can afford to be choosy with things like credit rating and requiring sizable deposits, leaving those who are financially precarious finding it nearly impossible to secure and keep stable housing.

With the Covid crisis hitting hard at home, my wife out of work, and reduced hours for me, we had no idea how we were to pay rent, but CDAIDE came in to save us from all the stress we had. Thank you so much CDAIDE.

IN EACH OTHER'S CARE WE THRIVE.






